Mission

The mission of Roslindale Village Main Street (RVMS) is to promote Roslindale Village as an appealing destination and the dynamic center of our community. As an independent non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, we bring together local volunteers, businesses and public agencies to strengthen the Village’s economic vitality, physical appearance and unique local character.

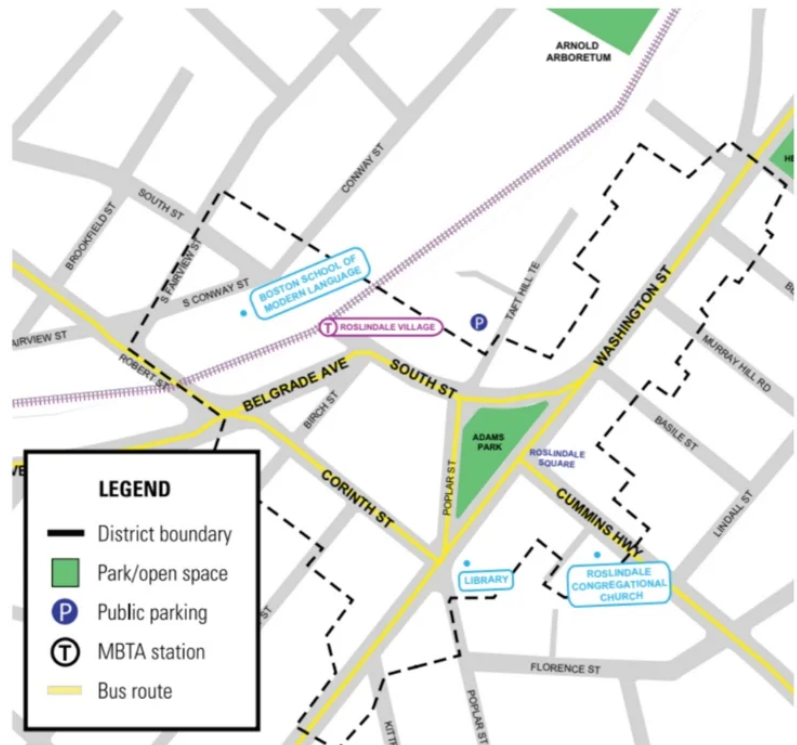
RVMS follows the operating principles of the National Main Street Center. The Main Street Approach advocates a return to community self-reliance, local empowerment, and the rebuilding of traditional commercial districts based on their unique assets: distinctive architecture, a pedestrian-friendly environment, personal service, local ownership, and a sense of community. Harnessing the efforts of local volunteers builds long-term success by fostering community involvement and commitment to a shared vision for the neighborhood.

Catchment Area

Main Street organizations like RVMS focus on improving the downtown areas of a community rather than the entire city or town.

RVMS serves Roslindale Village and the businesses and public spaces located within the specific geographical boundaries depicted in this map.

Businesses outside of our catchment area can still contact us to be connected with the City of Boston for assistance and resources.



History

RVMS was established in 1985 as one of the first urban Main Street Programs in the nation, with the help of then City Councilor Thomas M. Menino and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Within its first three years, RVMS achieved great success in revitalizing Roslindale Village, with 33 façade changes, 43 commercial building rehabilitations, 29 net new businesses, and 132 net job gains—totaling over \$5 million in new investments. Roslindale Village Main Street received a National Main Streets Urban Pioneer Award in 2006 for its revitalization efforts.

Today, Roslindale Village is a thriving commercial hub, with free public wifi in Adams Park, and a fabulous Farmers Market. And, there are now 20 Main Street Districts in the City of Boston. We are proud to have been the first one!

Our Work

Along with the numerous community events and programming we provide, we specifically support the local business community through a variety of annual programs and resources including:

- Technical Assistance
 - We partner with the City of Boston's Office of Economic Opportunity and Inclusion and other organizations to connect businesses with technical assistance in the areas of finance, marketing, business strategy, accounting, legal, and more.
 - We have a partnership with Small Business Strong to offer technical assistance to our businesses free of charge. Small Business Strong provides expedited, pro-bono resources to small businesses ranging from access to capital to consulting, business restructuring, business growth, digital marketing, and customer engagement plans.
 - If you are in need of technical assistance, reach out to us at director@roslindale.net.
- Promotion
 - Every week, we send out a newsletter to over 7,500+ subscribers in the community highlighting businesses in Roslindale Village, upcoming events, and resources for residents and business owners.
 - You can submit content for the newsletter by emailing the information and an image or graphic to manager@roslindale.net with "newsletter" in the subject line by Tuesday at 5pm. We also include this content in our social media posts on Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter.
- Advocacy
 - If you are having trouble getting a permit, working with your landlord, hearing back from the City of Boston, or any other barrier, please reach out to our Executive Director at director@roslindale.net. We will work with you to see what options there are and how we can help advocate for you and your business. We have connections with our local politicians and we can connect you with their office for further assistance. We also offer letters of support for businesses who are applying for a grant or permits with the City.
- Resource Hub
 - We maintain a list of current [small business resources](#) on our website and send out new resources and grant opportunities through our weekly email newsletter. If you would like to share a resource in our directory or newsletter, email us at manager@roslindale.net.
 - We post any vacant spaces on the vacancies page of our website. If you are looking for a new space for your businesses, check there to see what's available in our business district.

- Emergency Relief
 - In times of need, RVMS will work to provide emergency relief to our small business community when possible. In the past we've provided COVID-19 mini grants and organized the temporary placement of businesses after the Corinth Street Crash in 2022.

- Discounted Vendor Fees at RVMS Events
 - We invite our businesses to participate as vendors in our events like our local Farmer's Market and Holiday Market at a discounted rate.

- "Shop Local" Events
 - Every year, we host Small Business Saturday in Roslindale where we promote local shopping and publish gift guides. Did you know that the first Small Business Saturday was actually started here in Roslindale with the help of RVMS?
- Business Networking and Workshops
 - RVMS plans business networking events and workshops for business owners throughout the year.
 - We will be sure to let business owners know about any upcoming events and workshops. If you have a suggestion for a workshop topic, reach out to us at manager@roslindale.net.
- ROSStore Sign Improvement Program - Coming Soon!
 - RVMS will award seed investments for new signage to businesses towards a new sign for their business. Businesses will apply through a simple application, which will be reviewed by RVMS staff and board.

- Grant Matching - Coming Soon!
 - RVMS will soon have an approved list of grant programs. If a business successfully applies for and is awarded one of these grants, the business can apply for our Grant Matching program. If approved, RVMS will match the grant up to a certain amount.
 - Other grants outside of our approved list will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
